

EPISTLE READING 2 Corinthians 5:20b-6:10


We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.


















SERMON

NICENE CREED

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.




PROCLAMATION OF CHRIST

LORD'S PRAYER






RECEPTION OF THE SACRAMENT OF THE ALTAR


